### Key words and their meaning linked to helping others:

**Help and support** Making it easier for somebody to do something. **Provide** Give something to somebody.

**Healthy** Not likely to become ill or sick. **Brave** Doing things that are difficult or dangerous.

**Courage** Not showing fear when something is scary. **Community** All the people who live in a particular area. **Emergency** – A serious or dangerous event which needs to be dealt with straight away.
