## **Results day - Y4 MTC and Y1 Phonics**

Please note that Monday 22nd June marks the official release of both the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check and Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check results. Parents should expect to receive the individual results for their children shortly.

To provide some context on how these are scored: the Phonics Screening Check is scored out of a total of 40 marks, with the expected pass standard typically set at 32.

Meanwhile, the Multiplication Tables Check is scored out of 25; please note that there is no official pass mark or threshold for this assessment, as it is designed to simply provide a snapshot of your child's fluency in their times tables.
