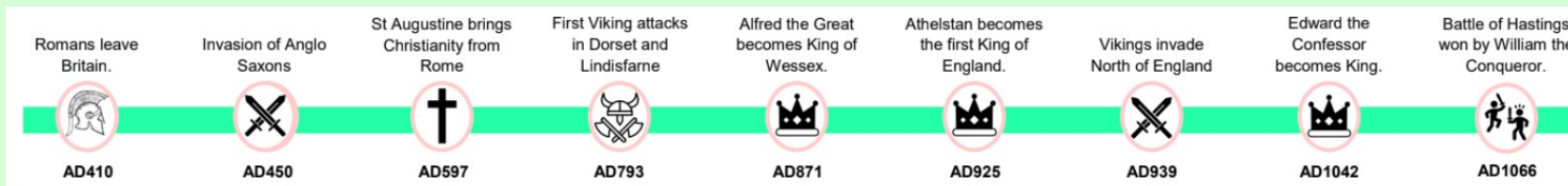


Anglo Saxons and Vikings Knowledge Organiser



<u>Key Information</u>
The Romans withdrew from Britain around 410 AD and Anglo-Saxons invaded!
The Anglo-Saxons created 7 Kingdoms.
Anglo-Saxon and Viking words are still used today, in place names and days of the week.
The Vikings came from Scandinavia (Norway, Denmark and Sweden) and invaded Lindisfarne in Northern England.
Vikings and Anglo-Saxons were of Pagan religion but converted to Christianity.
Bede and Gildas were monks who wrote about life in Anglo-Saxon Britain and the leaders of Britain.

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	
Pagan	A person who worships many Gods or Goddesses
Danelaw	The area where the Vikings resided.
Conquer	To take control of a place or people by force.
Migration	Movement from one place to another.
Settlement	A small colony or community where people live.
Monastery	A building where people worship and devote their time to God.
Lindisfarne	A monastic site attacked by the Vikings.
Artefacts	Evidence from the past which shows what life was like.
